# KAILA'S STORY Commitment to a Better Future

At 19 years old, Kaila was struggling to secure stable housing with her two children after committing to her sobriety. She was looking for a place where she could be surrounded by supportive people in an environment that offered structure to her life. Kaila found that Warren Village would offer her the guidance of a Family Advocate and a safe home where her son could be returned to her care from his foster placement.

#### "I'm so grateful for the supportive Warren Village community."

Within two months of her moving in, Kaila's three-year-old son, Claiton, was permanently reunited with her and her daughter, Delaini. At Warren Village she found in-home services to help with the transition of being a family unit again. Recently, Kaila celebrated her two-year sobriety, has completed food services training at the Work Options for Women program, and is currently employed at a four-star restaurant on the 16th Street Mall.

Kaila's journey is inspiring as she reaches her sobriety milestones and achieves her dream of becoming an LPN in an assisted living community. She is motivated by taking one day at a time and appreciates the support from Warren Village staff and community. Claiton and Delaini are enrolled in our nationally-accredited Learning Center, and are meeting developmental and early learning goals.

For Kaila, the last three years have been full of hurdles, but she believes that she can truly live for today, knowing that her family is together and that she can keep moving forward. Kaila reflects on her Warren Village journey, "I'm so grateful for the supportive Warren Village community. I'm inspired by what I see here every day. I honestly don't know where I would be without the help and guidance of such an amazing community and committed staff of Family Advocates."

Like Kaila, many single parents arrive needing support and encouragement. She found that Warren Village would offer her the guidance of a Family Advocate and a safe place to call home.

### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Since 1974, Warren Village has served **4,507** families through providing safe affordable housing, a nationally recognized early Learning Center, and Family Services that equip our residents with life and career-building skills.

Of the 49 families who exited the program during the last year:

- 86% found permanent housing
- 78% increased their personal competencies in life skills
- 76% maintained a fulltime schedule of education and/or employment
- 94% participated in career exploration, financial literacy and next-step housing guidance
- 78% had a positive income change

#### FINANCIAL EMPOWERMENT CENTER SUCCESS STORY Khadijatu Fofanah Found Financial Success Through mpowered Partnership

When Khadijatu took the important step to remove herself and her daughter from their former household, they had been evicted two times in the last year, once while she was pregnant and once with a newborn. She knew it was time to move on and find a new path for her daughter.



Warren Village resident, Khadijatu Fofanah, found a financial foothold at mpowered.

Khadijatu's situation was complicated by her daughter's asthma diagnosis. She found herself running back and forth, to and from doctors appointments and late to work as well as missing work on several occasions. This resulted in a series of lost jobs for Khadijatu. She ended up homeless and feeling like she had let her parents down. They had made the difficult journey

from Sierra Leone and worked hard to make sure that they provided a good foundation for Khadijatu. With this heavy emotional burden, Khadijatu started looking for answers and resources to help get her and her daughter back on their feet.



They found everything they needed at Warren Village. Thanks to the guidance of Family Advocate, Lynn Halfmann, and other Family Services team members, they were able to establish a place to live and rebuild their life being surrounded by other supportive resources. One of these resources was access to an on-site *mpowered* financial coach as part of the Financial Empowerment Center program. Khadijatu had a long road ahead of her to come back from the previous evictions, debts from medical bills, and a past bankruptcy. After her first meeting with her *mpowered* coach Olga, she reports that she "really put everything into perspective" as they discussed the past and developed financial goals for the future.

It's been two years since her first meeting with Olga, and Khadijatu reports that she has "transformed from survival to self-sufficiency" since 2014. Due to the hard work she's done with her financial coach she can "envision a strong future." She has raised her credit score by over 100 points (to over 700!) and is planning to move into permanent housing in 2017.

Losing a home can happen to anyone. Job loss, high housing costs, family break-ups, domestic violence, and illnesses are among the most common causes of homelessness.

Over the past 10 years there's been a 322% increase of school-aged children known to be homeless in Metro Denver.

Almost half (47%) of those experiencing homelessness in Metro Denver are families with children.

**43%** of Metro Denver residents indicate that they know family members or friends who have experienced homelessness.
