Where Families Flourish



Warren Village is a Colorado nonprofit serving unhoused, low-income, single-parent families in Denver. We provide families with the space and resources to achieve economic mobility and well-being. Warren Village utilizes a 2Gen approach to support parents and their children through adult enrichment classes, a high-quality Early Learning Center, education and career support, and resource navigation. Warren Village currently serves families at three locations: the Gilpin Campus; lvy Crossing Apartments, a satellite location in partnership with FCP/BMC Invest-

ments that provides resources to residents; and First Step, a residential communal living space for teen mothers and their children working toward their high school diploma or GED. In Fall 2024, our third campus - the Alameda Campus - will open.










EARLY LEARNING CENTER EARNS 5-STAR COLORADO SHINES RATING



The Early Learning Center (ELC) continued to excel this year, and was awarded a distinguished Colorado Shines 5-Star rating. The Colorado Shines rating system monitors, supports, and evaluates various aspects of an early learning program, including program administration, staff qualifications, family partnerships, and learning environments. The prestigious 5-Star rating signifies the highest level of quality in early childhood education and care at the ELC and reflects Warren Village's commitment to providing an enriching and developmentally appropriate environment for young learners.

MY TEACHING STRATEGIES GOLD SCORES FOR EARLY LEARNING CENTER STUDENTS

My Teaching Strategies GOLD is an inclusive assessment tool that enables teachers to assess development in children from birth to kindergarten. These are the scores across six areas of development for all children in the Warren Village Early Learning Center.

BREAKING GROUND AT THE ALAMEDA CAMPUS



On August 30, 2023, Warren Village reached a significant milestone toward its goal of serving 89 additional families as the community broke ground on the new Alameda Campus to celebrate the beginning of construction on this community-centered housing complex.


"We embark on an extraordinary journey with the groundbreaking of Warren Village at Alameda. This expansion underscores our un-

wavering commitment to promote community advancement through accessible housing solutions," said Ethan Hemming, President & CEO of Warren Village. "Through this new facility, we will continue to empower families and cultivate an environment where their potential can flourish."

Warren Village at Alameda is set to redefine the affordable housing landscape in Denver, offering 89 apartment homes comprising a mix of one-, two-, and three-bedroom units, an early learning center, community space, and adult education services. The development aims to provide a secure and supportive living environment for families experiencing housing instability with a focus on single parents while fostering a path toward economic and personal independence.

Looking forward, Warren Village will serve 85% more families and increase its staff by nearly 40% to support residents at Alameda. Hiring began with Vice President of Supportive Services, Karen Fox Elwell, in November 2023 and Director of Supportive Services at Alameda, Andrea Chapman, in April 2024, and will continue through 2024. Construction is anticipated to finish in late Fall 2024.
